Week 3 - Restoration: the example of David

Introduction

Besides Job, David is another person in the bible that experienced loss and restoration. Unlike Job, however, David's need for restoration was often caused by his own failings. Job's experience may seem a bit removed from our reality (he was described as blameless and upright afterall) but, for many people, David's story is a recognisable one. We see ourselves in his story of falling and getting back up again, being left for dead and then making an amazing comeback. As we study David's life today, we will look to learn from his experiences in finding restoration through his challenges.

Pilot text

<u>Psa 23:3</u> He restores my soul; He leads me in the paths of righteousness for His name's sake.

1 Sam 30:18-19 So David recovered all that the Amalekites had carried away, and David rescued his two wives. And nothing of theirs was lacking, either small or great, sons or daughters, spoil or anything which they had taken from them; David recovered* all.
